2014 WINTER STORMS

There have been at least 15 separate winter storms that have required response from the Hatfield Borough Public Works Department. The most significant storms were the February 4th – 6th ice & snow event that caused a Borough wide power outage. The initial outage was caused by a momentary power interruption on the PPL distribution lines. Shortly after that blip, all Borough power lines could not energize. Many of the lines were covered with debris from fallen trees or damaged by falling branches. As in any emergency event, it is necessary to identify the problem, gather the resources essential for repairs, develop and execute a recovery plan; all during extreme weather conditions. As you can see by the picture above, this can be a daunting task. Remember this is one isolated incident on February 5th. There were several more that required at least the same manpower response.

The snow storm of February 13th that lasted through the 15th, created a great deal of challenges. The Northeast region was hit with a salt shortage and manpower was stretched to the limits. Many years of planning and cooperation between Hatfield Borough & Township proved valuable during this storm. The large joint salt storage facility constructed by the Borough and Township kept both municipalities supplied with salt. Utilizing outside contractors helped the Borough Public Works Crew keep up with the storm.

The culmination of all these storms have created a shortfall in weather related budget line items. Borough Council has directed staff to review all funds (General, Sewer, Electric, etc.) and look for ways to reduce expenditures.

2014 WINTER ROAD DAMAGE ASSESSMENT

Borough & PENNDOT roads have taken a beating from the 15 winter storms. Many roads will require some method of repair. Many will require patching with crack sealing and seal coating. Some will require mill and overlay. The roads pictured below are state roads requiring PENNDOT maintenance and repair. Hatfield Borough Council and Mayor Kaler are calling on State Representative Bob Godshall and State Senator Stewart Greenleaf to encourage PENNDOT to place these roads at the top of the repair list.

UNEXPECTED COSTS FROM WINTERS COLD BLAST

Due to the extreme cold weather from the Polar Vortex that gripped much of the nation for several weeks, the Borough of Hatfield was levied with an unexpected high cost for electric capacity. The PJM that distributes electric to about a third of the nation experienced additional cost due to extremely high demand. The FERC (Federal Energy Regulatory Commission) allowed the distributors of electric and their parent organization pass those costs on to end users. Several States have held, Consumer Affairs hearings on this subject. Hatfield Borough Council is waiting for a response from the hearings. Should the increased cost be upheld, Borough Council will be forced to pass the cost on to Borough customers. At this time, Borough Council is considering a .0055 per KWH increase for not more than 10 months to recover the \$ 74,761.00 additional non-budgeted electric charge. Borough Council considers this cost to be excessive and has made its feelings known to State Officials.

I'm trying to make a fun segue to the fact that your Hatfield Borough and Montgomery County taxes are currently due. If your payment is postmarked by April 30, 2014 you will receive a 2% discount. My collection hours during discount are Wednesday April 2,9,16 from 11:00am - 2:00pm and April 23,24,25,28,29,30 from 10:00 am - 4:00 pm closed noon - 1:00pm for lunch. I have added extra hours to my schedule on June 30th, the last day of face from 11:00am to 2:00pm at the Borough Office.

Reminder, please be on the look out for your North Penn School District tax bill in your mail on/or before July 1, 2014. If you do not receive your tax bill contact me as soon as possible. The millage rate for your school taxes will not be determined until mid June.
