

REMINDER: the Borough Office will be closed on December 31, 2013

Thank you to everyone who paid their taxes. The face amount of the School tax bill is currently due. I will be available at the Borough Office on October 31, 2013 and December 30, 2013 from 11am-2pm to accept your payment. After Thursday October 31st, a 10% penalty will be added. I will not be able to accept personal checks as payment after December 15, 2013. Cash, certified check or money order will be accepted as payment only. If you need to contact me, kindly call the Borough Office at 215-855-0781, option 7 and leave me a detailed message. I check my messages on a regular basis and will get back to you as soon as I am able. I will be happy to schedule an appointment to meet with you.

PLEASE NOTE: I DO NOT HANDLE THE EARNED INCOME TAX RETURN. I collect real estate/property taxes for the County, Borough and North Penn School District. Please contact Berkheimer Tax Administrator directly at www.hab-inc.com or call 800-360-8989 regarding EIT and make sure you specify "Earned Income" tax.
