Larry Stevens is titled, "Walking Tour of Historic Hatfield Borough". It features 39 different locations and contains 15 old photographs. The tour is written with Centennial Park on Cherry Street as a starting point, but can just as well start and stop almost anywhere along the route. The whole tour, taken at a leisurely pace, can easily last several hours. The brief descriptions that are given for each site give a small glimpse into the history of some of the people, businesses, and churches that have made Hatfield Borough into the community that we know today.

The book was released on Monday, June 22, 2009, at the Borough's Founders Day event at Centennial Park. The Hatfield Museum & History Society had a small display in the Historic Hatfield Borough Jailhouse building next to the park.

"Be Aware....Get Involved....Stay Safe" Call Call 911 911 Vandalism Present in Borough Parks

t's been a little over a year since the Service Memorials at the Electric Plant Park were dedicated, but if you wanted to view them today, you're out of luck. They are no longer displayed thanks to the frequent vandalism that has forced Borough Officials to store the untouched memorials in a safe place. Problems at the park, located in front of the Borough Hall on South Main Street, began in the Fall of last year, with

damage to the pond-less waterfall. They escalated over the winter and spring months with the destruction and theft of four of the seven memorials located at the base of the flagpoles.

Each of the seven memorial plaques honored the five branches of the US Armed Forces along with our own Police and Fire Departments.

The Electric Plant Park has not been the only park in the Borough affected by vandals. Residents of Cherry Street have often complained of problems at Centennial Park involving graffiti, litter, damage to playground equipment, and late night loitering.

The Borough's Public Safety Commission, in an effort to keep our neighborhoods safe, has initiated a "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" campaign. The parks belong to the community and problems there could escalate to problems in the neighborhoods. The Commission is asking every resident to be alert to any vandalism, suspicious illegal

activity, destruction of property, and/or any disturbance they witness in our streets, parks, or neighborhoods. They should respond by calling 911. The police will keep your name and address confidential.

Borough Council is also considering other possible measures to curtail future vandalism and destruction of public property up to and including video surveillance of all parks and Borough owned properties.

Liberty Bell Plaza Dedication in Fall

Renovations to the Liberty Bell Trail Plaza and Parking Lot are nearing completion with the recent installation of the Borough's new 17-foot-tall, four-faced clock on East Broad Street. The new clock, surrounded by a decorative brick planter, is the main attraction in the newly updated plaza. The plaza is also home to 4 picnic tables with benches, old-style light fixtures, decorative planters, trash receptacles, a bicycle rack, and an imprinted asphalt trail which is a continuation of the Liberty Bell Trail theme.

Renovations to the parking lot on East Lincoln Avenue have included LED lights, 49 lined parking spaces, landscaping, and a new multi-business sign. Upon total completion, the Borough will hold a dedication ceremony for the plaza and parking lot in early fall. The festivities will include a ribbon cutting ceremony followed by a reception with local dignitaries. Light refreshments will be served and all residents are invited to attend.

Wastewater Management "Swimming Pools"

Swimming pool owners should remember that disposing of chlorinated pool water must be handled responsibly, according to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

Pool water contains harmful chemicals and must be neutralized and disposed of correctly.

When chlorinated water is drained from a swimming pool into a storm sewer, it makes its way to a stream or other body of water where aquatic life is damaged or killed.

Pool water must be drained into the local sanitary sewer system or hauled off-site for disposal at an approved treatment facility.

Water may also be discharged onto the land surface provided:

- Water is de-chlorinated •
- Ph is between 6.5 & 8.5
- AND the land area is sufficient to prevent erosion and runoff into a ditch, creek, or other stormwater route.

For Your Safety

In conjunction with the 911 emergency telephone system, all property owners are required to have their house numbers clearly and prominently posted on the front of their house and/or mailbox. Emer-

gency responders must be able to locate your house without delay when called.

The numbers should be no less than 4" in height, in contrasting color to the background, and placed so as not to be obstructed by trees, shrubs, or porches. Preferably, they should also be reflective for greater nighttime visibility.

Remember, in an emergency situation every second counts!
