Borough Council Section

Borough Council held their Annual Retreat September 14th. During the planning and strategy session, Council directed the administrative staff to develop the 2012 Budget with NO TAX INCREASE and NO ELECTRIC RATE INCREASE. Council members Kenneth V Farrall, Chairman of the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee identified the recently awarded Open Space Grant extending the Chestnut Street Trail to connect the Liberty Bell Trail. While Councilman Bryan A. Moyer Chairman of the Public Safety Committee reminded staff the benefit of a DVIT Grant enabled the strategic placement of surveillance cameras. These grants saved the Borough thousands of dollars.



Leaf Pick-up / Curbside Chipping



<u>Leaves</u> Borough of Hatfield conducts a Fall Leaf collection every Monday from late October through the beginning of December. Residents must place leaves in biodegradable paper bags which can be purchased at any home improvement store and also at the Borough Hall for \$.25 each.

Bags must be placed near the front curb by morning for pick-up. No plastic bags will be accepted!

Limbs

The Borough also conducts a Tree Limb Chipping program every Spring & Fall. The intent of this collection is for the clean-up of debris from limbs that have fallen over time. Residents who choose to cut down a tree or bush on their property must make other arrangements for disposal.

- Only limbs and branches up to 6" in diameter will be chipped.
- Branches should be placed by your curb in an orderly pile with the trunk ends facing toward the road.
- Hedge and shrub clippings, tree stumps, as well as branches with thorns will not be collected.

Power Line Maintenance

Due to the Borough's commitment to reliable electrical service, the trimming of trees (10 foot clearance) around primary power lines will be accomplished this fall. The purpose of this endeavor is to protect the electrical wires and poles from damage due to overhanging tree limbs in high wind situations. Homeowners will be contacted via door hanger notices for this scheduled maintenance. Any resident with questions or concerns can contact the Public Works Department at 215-855-0781 opt. 2.

Christmas Trees

Discarded Christmas trees are picked up the first 2 Mondays of every new year. Trees should be cleaned of any decorations and place by the curb for early morning removal.

Residents are also reminded that open burning of leaves is strictly prohibited.

Compact Fluorescent Light bulbs (CFL's)

Compact fluorescent light bulbs or CFL's are a great way to reduce your electricity bill while lessening your carbon footprint. These types of bulbs, however, do contain a small amount of mercury and should be handled carefully and disposed of properly at all times. Intact CFL bulbs can be taken to any Home Depot, Lowes or Ikea stores for free proper disposal and recycling. CFL bulbs can also be taken to any County sponsored Household Hazardous Waste Event for free disposal and recyclina.

Please **DO NOT** throw them in the trash! Nationwide, over 670 million mercury-containing bulbs are discarded improperly each year. In Montgomery County most of these bulbs are ultimately land filled or incinerated. These disposal methods can lead to a release of mercury into the environment through breakage and leakage and ultimately contaminate the food chain.

# \*BUSINESS OWNER AND RESIDENTS\*RECYLING IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY Here are some helpful tips and tools:



So much trash has accumulated in the Pacific Ocean that it is now the size of Africa. Do your part! Learn how to reduce waste at home and work. It's free and easy. Recycle: Cans, plastic bags, plastic bottles, and glass We recommend and encourage you to take your newspapers to your local school where accepted.

Use plastic grocery/shopping bags. Buy canvas or nylon reusable bags and keep and use them when you shop.

Use sponges instead of paper towels whenever possible. Disinfect sponges by microwaving them damp for  $\bf 1$  minute or by running them through the next dishwasher cycle. Paper towels can be composted.

Use washable table napkins instead of paper napkins — cloth napkins are usually much larger and more absorbent than paper products, and they can dress up your dinner table too!

Buy washable cotton diapers check the yellow pages to see if there is a diaper service in your area. If you select those with velcro wraps, reusable diapers are just as convenient and may even be cheaper than disposable diapers.
