Community Improvement Project Update

Lincoln Avenue Bridge Construction

The next phase of the Lincoln Avenue Bridge Reconstruction will take place this summer. The rehabilitation to be undertaken includes constructing parapet walls and side treatments, the replacement of sidewalks and protective fences on both sides of the bridge, and the installation of new guiderails. In addition, the



new sidewalks will include a decorative brick paver feature.

This construction work will bring the new structure into compliance with current Penn DOT safety and accessibility standards. Deferred maintenance and age had caused the deterioration of the bridge. The rehabilitation work will correct these safety issues and make the bridge safer for vehicles and pedestrians.

The total cost of the project will be around \$85,000. The Borough has secured a Community Development Block Grant from Montgomery County for \$75,000 for the work. Look for work to commence in late summer.

Pesticides & Herbicides. Please bring mercury containing devices.

Miscellaneous: Dyes, lighter fluid, swimming pool chemicals, asphalt sealers.

A Safety Message from your Fire Marshall....

Outdoor Barbeque Safety Tips



- Keep your barbeque grill clean & free of grease buildups. Also, insects love to build nests in gas grill tubes. Follow the manufacturer's cleaning instructions.
- Grease fires are difficult to put out with water so be sure to have a fire extinguisher handy.
- Never start a gas grill with the lid closed.
- Never wear loose clothing that might catch fire during If your clothes do catch fire remember, a flare-up. drop to the ground & roll.
- 5. Never use a flammable liquid other than barbeque starter fluid to start your grill or smoker.
- When using starter fluid, place the container well away from the grill before lighting. Take care not to spill. And never ever add liquid starter to hot or even warm coals!
- 7. Wear insulated fire retardant mitts and use long handled tools designed for barbequing.
- Always shut off the valve to propane tanks when not in use.
- 9. Always shut off the dampers on your grill or smoker when
- 10. Never leave a hot grill unattended. And keep children and pets at a safe distance.

Lawn Mower Safety Tips

- Check the lawn first for objects such as bottles, stones, etc. Exercise similar caution when using lawn edgers. Propelled objects cause most lawn mower-related injuries.
- 2. Check that lawn mower guards and shields are functional.
- Set wheel height prior to starting the engine.
- 4. Always use care when filling the tank with gas. Wipe up spills and never fill the tank of a hot mower.
- When using a bag attachment, turn the mower off prior to removing or re-attaching the bag. Better yet, when using mulching mowers, there's no need to use a bag at all.
- 6. Very steep slopes are dangerous to mow. Consider an alternative to grass such as growing ground covers.
- 7. Mow only when the grass is dry, to reduce the risk of injury through slipping.
- 8. Wear appropriate clothing and use hearing protection such as earplugs.
- 9. Disconnect spark plugs when servicing the mower to prevent any accidental start-ups.
- 10. Never leave a running mower unattended.


