

# **Revitalization Draft Plan Complete**

The Hatfield Economic Revitalization Task Force has been working since January with it's consultants, Simone Collins Landscape Architecture and Urban Partners Economic Planners, to develop a plan to build on the success of the Borough's past revitalization efforts. It's focus has been on four specific goals and objectives:

- 1. Retention and expansion of existing businesses by exploring ways that the Borough could assist them with their concerns and needs.
- 2. Explore ways that the Borough could be more "business friendly" in those areas of the town where it would like to see business growth. This could include changes to the zoning ordinance as well as some zoning district changes.
- 3. Marketing the Borough as a great place to operate a business, focusing on the town's unique character, low property taxes, and very competitive electric

rates. The task Force has completed a business market analysis study to determine what types of businesses would most likely thrive in the Borough. A strategy will be developed to recruit these types of businesses and to find them a place in the Borough.

4. Explore funding possibilities to expand the Borough's Streetscape Enhancement program.

In addition, the Task Force is looking at providing additional parking in the Core Commercial area, enhancing the pedestrian environment by minimizing the impact of truck traffic and improving building facades. increasing home ownership, and the deconversion of multi-family units to singlefamily units.

## Traffic Calming Study: Slower Cars, Safer Hatfield

The Borough's roadways may be posted at 25 mph, but studies show-and residents knowspeeds on our roads are often closer to 35 to 45 mph.

So far, measures to slow traffic and increase pedestrian safety have included speed enforcement, speed limits painted on the roadway, and decorative crosswalks on Main Street to help increase the visibility of pedestrians.

With the completion of a borough-wide traffic calming feasibility study by McMahon Associates Inc. early in 2009, Hatfield Borough now has a three-phase traffic calming plan and a new review process to implement more traffic calming measure throughout the borough.

McMahon Associates provided the plan outlined here based on research and resident feedback. It serves as a starting point for the borough to make the most effective and costefficient improvements quickly, which improve several sections of the borough.

# Liberty Bell Trail Plaza Shaping Up

Work on the Liberty Bell Trail Plaza and Parking Lot has begun and should be completed by the end of July, according to Mark Mattucci, the Borough's engineer. Renovations to the parking lot will include 10 new LED lights, 49 lined spaces in three segments, and the removal of a utility pole and phone tower near Crystal Rose catering. The plaza will be home to a new Borough clock and a decorative brick planter, along with an imprinted asphalt trail signifying the Liberty Bell Trail. The Dial Howard Post four-faced clock will have a chime and will be cast in aluminum at the top of an ornate pole. The improvements to the parking lot include improvements to the drainage, lighting, landscaping, and signage. According to Borough Manager Mike DeFinis, 80% of the work is funded through a Montgomery County Revitalization Grant. A dedication ceremony will be scheduled after completion of the work.

# **Pool/Water Safety**

- Learn to swim!
- Never leave a child unobserved around water. Adult supervision is recommended and NEVER SWIM ALONE!
- Install a phone by the pool & know how to prevent, react, and respond to emergencies.
- Learn CPR and post instructions in the pool area.
- Enclose the pool completely with a self-locking, self-closing fence with vertical bars. Fence openings should be no more than 4 inches wide.
- Always keep basic lifesaving equipment by the pool & know how to use it. Pole, rope, and personal flotation devices (PDFs) are recommended.
- Watch out for the dangerous "too's" too tired, too cold, too far from safety, too much sun.
- Never mix alcohol with swimming or diving. It impairs your judgment, balance & coordination.
