Firefighters Awarded "Citizens of the Year"



In recognition of their 100 years of outstanding, dedicated, and loyal service to Hatfield Borough and the entire Hatfield community, Hatfield Borough Council, along with Mayor Robert L Kaler III, awarded the Hatfield Volunteer Firefighters the "Citizens of the Year" Award for 2009. The award and Resolution No. 2009-33 was recently presented to Fire Chief Bob Kaler IV.

The Hatfield Volunteer Fire Company was first founded on March 10, 1910 by a group of concerned Hatfield citizens. Their first piece of fire-fighting apparatus was purchased for \$1000 in August of that year and since then, the fire company has made every effort to provide its volunteers with the latest stateof-the-art firefighting, rescue, and safety equipment.

They will be celebrating their 100th anniversary in June 2010 with special events, a photo history book, and a parade tentatively scheduled. Check their website and signs outside the fire stations for information on upcoming events. *www.hatfieldfire.com*

2010 Budget Highlights

Borough Council passed the 2010 Budget at their Regular Council Meeting held December 16, 2009. There will be no increases to the Borough's electric and sewer rates for the new year. The commitment to Economic Revitalization of the Borough will continue with staff searching for County, State and Federal grant opportunities and/or appropriations.

Council also asked for and received a Road Improvement Plan from Public Works Director Fred Leister. This road project will be funded by Liquid Fuels money received from the State. Due to the escalating cost of conducting business, the Borough has experienced increases in fuel, insurance premiums, law enforcement, etc., and as a result of these increases, the average homeowner can expect a \$30 to \$40 increase in their real estate tax for 2010. The millage for real estate will go from 0.5225 to 0.7976 as well as the fire safety tax rising from 0.176 to 0.2024 mills. Even with the increase, taxes in the Borough will remain lower than they have been since 1997 when taxes were cut by 50 percent.

Borough Council will continue to review all departments and programs to deliver the highest quality standard for the residents and business owners.

Sewer Laterals to be Repaired in Borough

The Borough of Hatfield received an Appropriation for Sewer Repair under the Water Resources Development Act of 1996 Section 566. U.S. Representative Allison Schwartz (PA-13) appropriated the funds earmarked for this project which will improve the Borough's sewer system.

The Army Corps of Engineers will oversee the \$400,000 Sewer Lateral Repair Project (\$300,000 appropriation in conjunction with \$100,000 matching Borough funds) which will identify and repair sewer laterals connected to the Borough's sanitary sewer system. This project is the next phase in the Borough's efforts to evaluate and reduce the inflow and infiltration into the system and treatment plant.

The bidding of the project will be in early 2010 with implementation to start in the spring. It is expected to be totally completed by late Fall 2010.

Future information to affected property and business owners will be sent via direct mail.

Deicing Tips for Residents

Excess salt and other deicing chemicals can harm aquatic life in our streams and impact drinking water supplies. This winter, you can help by following these environmentally friendly snow removal practices:

- Shovel snow before it turns to ice to limit the need for deicing chemicals like rock salt.
- Shovel snow onto permeable surfaces including grassy areas so as the snow melts it will soak into the ground.

If you must use deicing chemicals, follow these suggestions:

- Avoid over application of chemical deicers.
- Limit applications near springs, streams, and water supply areas.
- Sand & sawdust can be used as an alternative to salt products.
- Sweep up residues after the snow melts to prevent it from washing into storm drains & streams.

🔌 Census 2010 - "It's In Our Hands" 🔌

B e on the lookout for the 2010 Census questionnaires which will be mailed or delivered to your house in March. This "short form" census will collect only basic information such as age, sex, race, house-hold relationships and whether your home is owned or rented. The questions ask you to provide information that is accurate for your household.

Your participation in the census is mandatory & required by law.

The census is mandated by the U.S. Constitution and has been conducted every 10 years since 1790. The data collected is used to distribute Congressional seats to states, to make decisions about what community services to provide, and to distribute over \$400 billion in federal funds to local, state and tribal governments each year for such things as hospitals, schools, public works projects, and emergency services.

It only takes a few minutes to answer the questions and your responses are strictly confidential and protected by law.

Every household in the United States will receive their form by March and any household that does not respond will be called or visited by a Census worker. (*They will be identified by a census badge and bag.*) Each questionnaire must be completely filled out and sent back in the postage page envelope enclosed with each form. Online filing of the census is not available at this time.

Pool Advisory Board



Reminders from The Fire Safety Inspector

2010 Inspections

The Fire and Safety Inspection Program for 2010 will begin in the next few weeks. All Borough businesses, industries, and multifamily residential properties will be inspected.



Single family homes that are currently 4. being rented are excluded.

In tenant occupied residencies, the inspector will check for properly located, working smoke detectors. The fire protection system of every business will be inspected and all onsite flammable materials will be checked for proper storage and handling. Sprinkler systems and paths of egress will also be checked.

Are You Ready for the Ice and Snow?



The Borough's Public Works crew is prepared for the snow and ice season. Are you?? According to most weather forecasts, this winter will bring more snow and ice than we have seen in several years. The following information may keep you safe in the snow:

- Always drive at a speed that matches the existing visibility, traffic, and road conditions.
- Wear your seat belt and clothing that makes it easy to move about in the car as well as provide warmth.
- Make sure you have a winter driving kit in your car that includes a bag of abrasive material, a small snow shovel, a flashlight, blanket, ice scraper, warning flares, and window washing solvent.
- If you are at work and it starts to snow, stay there. By waiting, it allows the road crews to plow and salt the roads.
- Before you start off, clean your windows, wipe your windshield wipers clean and replace them if necessary, fill your washer reservoir and clean all the snow off your car.
- Best of all, if the weather is bad, stay home and cuddle up with a cup of hot cocoa!

Novel H1N1 is a new strain of influenza that spreads from person to person just as the seasonal flu does, and is expected to be widespread this flu season.

The power to slow the spread of H1N1 is in your hands - literally.
